All attendees, speakers, sponsors, and staff at the Open Science Meeting 2019 are required to agree with the following code of conduct. Organizers will enforce this code throughout the event. We are expecting cooperation from all participants to help ensure a safe environment for everybody.

### Attending the GLP's Open Science Meeting 2019, you agree to:

- Respect the boundaries of other attendees.
- Communicate openly and thoughtfully with others and being considerate of the multitude of views and opinions that are different from your own.
- Be respectful and mindful in your critique of talks and ideas.
- Respect confidentiality requests by speakers and other attendees.
- Be mindful of your surroundings and look out for one another.
- Respect that the venues are public buildings and non-conference attendees are using it as well.

### Behaviors that do not belong at the OSM 2019:

- Harassment, intimidation, including verbal, written, or physical conduct to threaten, intimidate or coerce another person.
- Discrimination based on gender identity, sexual orientation, age, disability, physical appearance, body size, race, religion, national origin, or culture.
- Sexual harassment of any kind, including unwelcome sexual attention and inappropriate physical contact.
- Stealing or damaging venue property.
- Sustained and disrespectful disruption of presentations.
